



6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college is affiliated to University of Kerala. There is limited flexibility regarding the development of UG and PG programmes. The programmes are based on CBCSS introduced in 2009-10. However suggestions and issues regarding the curriculum are informed to the Board of studies for necessary action.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- ➤ A general time table for all classes is prepared and is made available to the students at the beginning of the academic year.
- Allotment of classrooms and recording of student's attendance are monitored at the institutional level.
- To boost the learning process of the students, an Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP) continues to exist for selected students.

- Teachers prepare the teaching plan of the topics allotted to each of them using lecture method, Interactive method, project based learning, computer assisted learning, seminars, discussions, debates, paper presentations etc.
- > ICT tools are extensively used in classrooms both by the faculty and students.
- Departments prepare their own detailed subject-wise time-table based on the general timetable.
- > Individual teachers are assigned work by the Head of the Department.
- > Copies of academic calendar are made available to the students and staff.

The College council discusses these programmes and finalizes the College calendar incorporating all such details.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- A senior teacher is appointed as the Chief Superintendent of Examinations at the college level to ensure effective implementation of evaluation reforms.
- > Internal examinations are conducted during each semester
- Class wise PTA meetings are held to monitor the students' academic progress and to facilitate a dialogue between parents and teachers.
- > Parents are informed of the periodic performance of students.
- > Evaluation through class tests, seminars, assignments and discussions.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- Three teachers are University approved research guides. They work in collaboration with other centres.
- Faculty members attended and presented papers in National, International seminars/workshops.
- > Faculty published papers in National and International Journals.
- > The college subscribes national/international journals.
- > Investigators are given permissible duty leaves and special recognition also.
- > Departments published Non-Peer Reviewed journals.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- ➢ Internet connectivity is made available in all the Departments.
- > Computer Lab with internet facility is provided for all the students and faculties.
- Books and reference materials are added to the existing system. Issue-return and search facilities are automated.
- Separate reading room, reference section, PG & UG Sections are available.
- > Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) facility is available in the library.

7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection

St. Xavier's College, affiliated to University of Kerala started functioning at Thumba in 1965. The land was a barren waste land during that period, which was gradually enriched to the present greenish ambience by the constant efforts of Jesuits along with the support of staff and students. The campus with around 85 acres of land has luxurious vegetation now, with diverse flora and fauna. Acacia trees, an invasive species dominated during the initial stages are gradually being replaced by fruiting and valuable indigenous trees. Environment friendly waste disposal and recycling systems are installed in the campus for promoting concepts of a zero-waste and plastic free campus drawing parallel concept from the **'Swachh Bharat Mission'**. The cricket stadium in the campus too is constructed in such a way that least disturbance of the natural ecosystem is done.

Planting trees and maintenance of the soil are promoted constantly through Nature club activities with the help of students and staff members. The Nature Club in collaboration with Dept. of Agriculture, Govt. of Kerala along with the support of College PTA and Kadinamkulam Panchayath has installed an 'Institutional Vegetable Garden Programme' for promoting organic farming in the College Campus.

The campus is famous for its scenic beauty. Most plants used as specimens for curriculum are collected from the campus itself. With the diverse flora, the campus is a habitat and a natural feeding/ breeding site for many birds. Peacocks displaying its beautiful plumage is a common sight in our campus. Aquatic ecosystems in the form of ponds are currently maintained by the college and are in fact habitats for a few local endangered freshwater fishes. The campus soil is properly maintained, as it is naturally low in moisture content, high in salinity and acidity. The Campus follows 'Green Protocol' by limiting the use of plastic waste, promoting bicycle riders and adopting eco-friendly strategies for a 'Greener, Cleaner Campus'.

(I)Financial aid for the marginalized students

The institution takes a lot of measures towards equity which is one of the core values of the institution. The main programmes undertaken are listed below:

- Noon meal scheme: the present and retired faculty of the college had raised a fund to provide free noon meals for the financially weak students.
- Student Support Fund: the faculty as well as beneficiaries of the institution had raised a fund to provide interest free loans for the poor students.
- Student Empowerment fund: this fund aims to provide financial aid for the poor, academically good, hostlers of the institution. They can use the amount to pay their hostel fees, tuition fees or to buy academic books.
- Book Bank: Academic books are collected from passing out students and are distributed among the poor students of succeeding batches.
- Scholarships: different scholarships are installed by the retired faculty of the college to provide support to the financially weak and academically good students.

(II) Eco-friendliness

Eco-friendliness is one of the five core values of the institution. The following steps are taken by the institution towards maintaining the eco-friendliness of the campus
