The college has 8 teaching departments and the Academic Audits have been carried out by competent academicians in the respective area of study. The departments are listed below.

- 8. Commerce

Out of 8 departments in the college, 2 departments (Departments of Physics and Commerce) offer post graduate courses.

College offers the Add-on courses approved by the UGC to the students.

Curriculum Feed back and Teacher evaluation by students are conducted regularly.

Remedial classes and mentoring sessions are carried on a regular basis in order to provide support to the students in academic and personal matters. The recommendations made by the auditors in each academic year are taken in to serious considerations and put in to practice by the respective departments for improving the performance of the department.

Administrative Audit

The College Office, which stands as the key unit of administration, undergoes internal and external audits every year.

Budget allocation is planned and implemented for all major sections.

Expenditure Statement is verified and certified by a Chartered Accountant.

The major files are properly organized and documented.

All recommendations and suggestions in the Audit Report are considered and followed by the administration and the remedial measures taken every year are recorded in the immediate next report.

The department was started in the year 1977 for handling additional language classes for predegree and degree students. Later it was classified as career oriented programme. The department also handles the Additional language of BA, B.Sc., B.Com, and BBT programmes.

Auditor's recommendations

- 2. Appointment of permanent faculty for mass communication has to be considered
- 3. The department lacks a media lab.
- Library facilities for Mass Communication students need to be improved.
- 5. Daily access need to be provided to reading material like newspapers and magazines.
- Career guidance need to be provided for 6th semester students.
- Field visits need to be conducted to media organizations.
- Video production may be promoted every year based on college activities.

Concluding observations

- 1. The department is organizing seminars, workshops and fests for the students.
- The literary talents of students are promoted through literary forum, department journal and manuscript magazine.
- Student internship and visit to media firms are useful learning exercises.
- The department has some innovative student support practices.
- The results have been good for three out of the five year audit period.
- 3. Fifty percent of faculty is guest faculty.

- Conduct bridge course on economics so that the students from science background also could grasp the concepts easily.
- Faculty members have to present papers in national and international seminars and also publish articles in refereed journals.
- The students should be encouraged to use library facilities.
- Start value added courses which would help the students to acquire soft skills.
- Other than class room teaching, invited talks of experts could be conducted.
- More value added courses have to be given which would help the comprehensive development of the students.
- 8. Start remedial and bridge course in Mathematics for the better results of the students of the department.

Concluding observations

- Faculty strength has been consistent during the audit period.
- The department has been offering remedial coaching, bridge course and value added courses.
- Research activities by Faculty members are limited to attendance and paper presentations at seminars and conferences.
- 4. Results have varied from year to year.

- Study tours and industrial visits are to be conducted.
- Faculty research is to be strengthened with more publications.
- Extension and extracurricular activity is not satisfactory.
- 5. Steps for campus selection are to be taken using the proximity to Techno Park.
- Introduce a student scholarship scheme for supporting economically weak and meritorious students with the help of fund generation from alumni members.
- Industry-academic linkage programmes are to be chartered out in collaboration with nearby industries and Techno park institutes.

Concluding observations

- 1. The faculty members are engaged in research activities.
- 2. The department is organizing a series of seminars in the department for the benefit of students.
- 3. The department is offering value added courses useful to the students.
- The department library and research room will help in enhancing the quality of academic activities of the department.
- The UG results were good except for one year (2015-16). The PG results were also good except for 2016-17.
- 6. Fifty percent of faculty members are guest faculty.

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Department of Chemistry

The Department of chemistry is the oldest department in the campus. The department offers B.Sc. degree in Chemistry.

- 5. There is only one regular faculty in the department; all the others are guest faculty.

Department of Botany and Biotechnology

Department of Botany and Biotechnology had its beginning as the Department of Biology, training students at pre-degree level in zoology as a subsidiary subject. The Department of Botany and Biotechnology was established in January 2000. The degree course offered now is a restructured one with Botany as the core main*subject, Biotechnology as the vocational main subject and Biochemistry as a complementary subject. Currently, the department is a full-fledged one with 5 permanent faculty members, green house, botanic garden, zoological museum etc.

Two of the regular faculty members had doctorate qualification. One of them was an approved research guide of the University and one candidate was awarded Ph.D. degree under his guidance in 2016-17.

Value added courses

During 2015-16 a certificate course on "ENTREPRENEURSHIP" was started to equip the students to start their own business ventures. This course was planned to inculcate entrepreneurial skills among students.

Another certificate course on "INCOME TAX PROCEDURE AND PRACTICE" was started in 2016-17 to enable the students to acquire the skills required to work as income tax practitioner.

During 2017-18, one more certificate course on "GST RETURN FILING" was introduced on the basis of requests received from the parents of the students.

Research by Faculty

Three faculty members have been publishing papers in research journals every year. They have also been presenting papers at conferences and seminars during the audit period.

Remedial coaching

Students with low grasping power were given remedial classes during free hours, especially, in the morning (9:00- 9:30 AM) and evening (3:30-4:00 PM). In addition to the above, Scholar Support Programme was conducted for students for difficult subjects.

Model examination

Model examinations were conducted prior to end semester university examinations. This was done in pursuance of the recommendation of the academic auditor.

Co-curricular activities

The department has a variety of co-curricular activities which include departmental seminars, Soft skills programmes, motivational programmes, career guidance sessions, alumni interaction, business quiz programmes, investment games, trade fest, commerce day celebrations, study tours, etc

Activity clubs

The students of the department organized two activity clubs, namely, Entrepreneurship Development club and Investors' club for gaining practical experience in related activities.

Charity initiative

The department organizes "Snehapoorvam St. Xaviers" every year to inculcate social commitment among students. The fund collected from commerce students through "Snehapoorvam St. Xaviers programme is donated to RCC (Regional Cancer Center) at the end of the year. It is an extension activity of the department.

Sports and Arts activities

Students of the department participate and win prizes in inter collegiate and university level sports competitions and also national level sports competitions. They also participate and win prizes in University Youth Festivals.

Book Bank scheme

The department has a Book Bank Scheme to supportfinancially weak students. Text Books of previous semester are donated toDepartment by the students so that students of poor financial backgroundcan borrow it for study.

Department Magazine and Journal

The Department publishes a magazine titled "PIONEER".

Department Journal "BUSINESS COMMUNICATOR" is being published since 2016.

- Fast learners are to be encouraged to support slow learners.

Concluding observations

- 1. The department has won the 'Best Commerce Department in Kerala' award in a competition.
- The department offers Value added courses useful to the students.
- 3. Research activity by faculty is commendable even though it is limited to three faculty members.
- The department has important academic best practices such as remedial coaching, model examination, and publication of department magazine and journal.
- 5. The department has a variety of co-curricular activities catering to the different needs of students.
- 6. The department has a valuable charity initiative.
- 7. Participation of students in sports and arts competitions is commendable.
- 8. The book bank scheme and activity clubs are other commendable initiatives.
- 9. The results of both UG and PG programmes are very good.
- 10. Four out of the nine faculty members are guest faculty.

A Consolidated Report on Performance Appraisal of Non Teaching Staff from 2013-14 to 2017-18

An appraisal of performance of non-teaching staff from the academic year 2013-14 to 2017-18 was conducted. The data were collected through a structured questionnaire on various factors, such as, co-operation with colleagues, co-operation with public, cheerfulness of the employee, perceptiveness to the needs towards different stakeholders, ability to motivate and supervise, responsibility, positiveness, punctuality, efficiency and problem solving.

The performance of non-teaching staff on the above mentioned attributes for five years were consolidated and presented in the following table.

- Co-operation with colleagues: The non teaching staff's co-operative attitude towards
 their colleagues is evaluated using a three point scale. All the respondents (100 %)
 marked the highest positive response in the questionnaire. It reveals that all staff
 members are co-operative in nature.
- 2) Co-operation with public:- The co-operative attitude of non teaching staff's towards the needs of the public, viz, parents, vendors, well wishers, etc were examined in detail. The analysis revealed that all the respondents (100 %) are having a cooperative attitude towards public.

3) Cheerfulness:- the cheerfulness of the non teaching staff towards the faculty and public was evaluated. The result showed that all the members are always cheerful when they meet faculty members, students and public.

4) Perceptiveness:- the non teaching staff's perceptiveness towards the needs of faculty, students and institution were examined in detail. The study exhibits that 97.92 percentage of the respondents are highly perceptive towards the needs of different groups.

5) Workability: - It deals with the ability of non-teaching staff to motivate, supervise and effectively work for the interest of students. 97.92 percentage of them possess this attribute.

6) Responsibility:- it indicates the responsibility of non-teaching staff in carrying out the assigned tasks. It is observed from the analysis that all the non teaching staff were highly responsible for discharging their assigned duties.

7) Punctuality:- The punctuality of non teaching staff was also evaluated. It is noticed that majority of the respondents (85.42 %) are very punctual. Some of them are late due to some unexpected exigencies. However, they took permission from the competent authority for such delay.


8) Positiveness:- it deals with the positive response of non teaching staff towards the instructions, guidance, corrections and commands of superiors of the institution. The analysis showed that all the non teaching members were positive towards these factors.

9) Efficiency: - The efficiency and effectiveness in performing the assigned work were examined in depth. The analysis result disclosed that 93.75 percentage of non teaching staff are competent to meet work standards and finish their work on time.

10) Problem Solving:- the skills of non teaching staff in analyzing, identifying and finding effective solutions to the problems were analyzed. The test results exhibit that 91.67 percentage of them possess the ability of problem solving.
